When you turn 18, that original \$20 deposit will be worth \$22.78 and all you had to do was open an account.

Make saving a habit now and you will enjoy more money later.

11. Sturdy shoes or boots
12. Medicine

14. Copies of ID cards

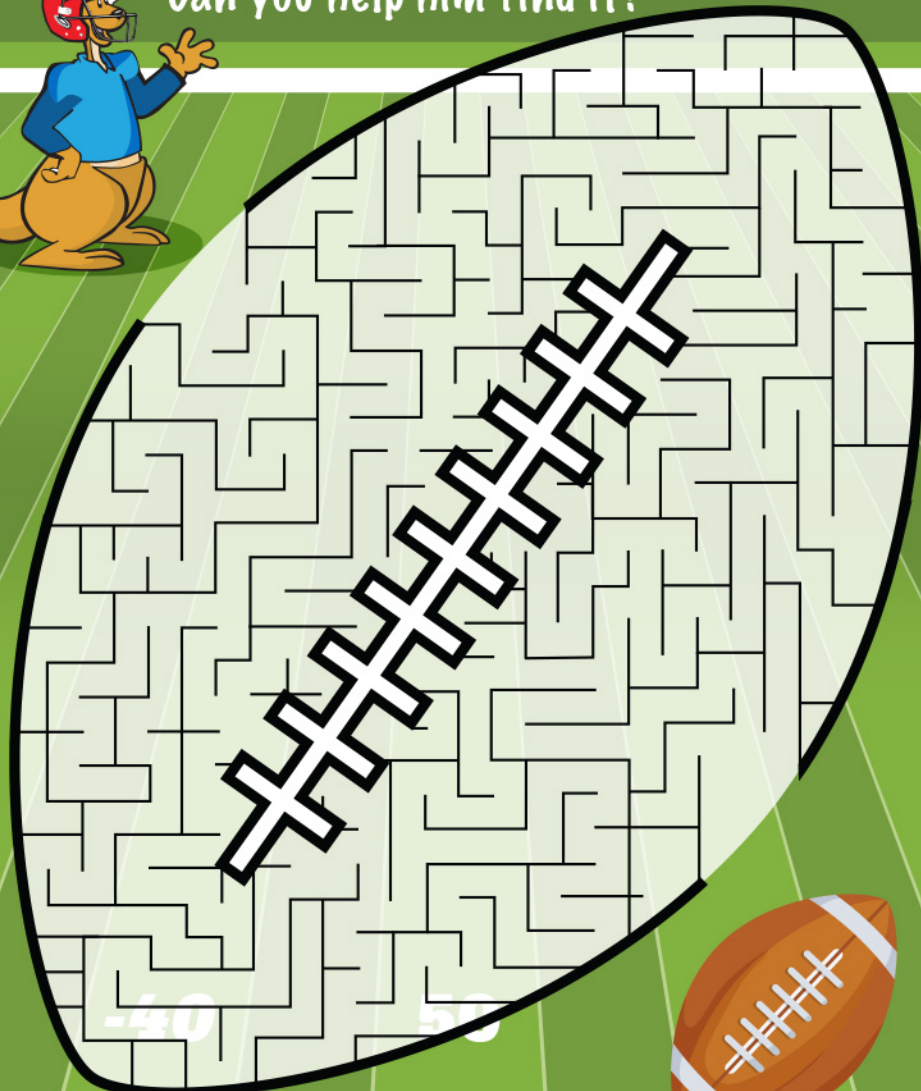
